Economic Plans- Trump and Harris

TRUMP PLAN

- 1. Recommends reduction in corporate tax rate to 15%. The 2017 TCJA permanently reduced the corporate tax rate from a statutory tax rate of 35 percent of taxable income to 21 percent. This proposal would lower that rate to 15 percent.
- 2. Increase trade tariffs- 10%. This amount varies by speech from 20% on goods from other countries and 60% on China and even a 200% tax on some imported cars. Trump claims that these taxes are not going to cost you but another country. US companies pay the tariff and the result is either they have lower profits or pass on the price increase to you (inflation). Trump imposed a 40% tariff on imported washing machines in 2018 and the prices to US consumers increased by 12% and overall US consumers paid \$1.5 billion a year in extra costs.
- **3.** Wants to eliminate taxes on Social Security benefits. If your social security income is more than \$25,000 for an individual or \$32,000 for married couple you have to pay federal income taxes. However the standard deduction for 2024 is \$14,600 for single filers and \$29,200 for joint filers. And for older adults there is an additional deduction of \$1950 for single and for couples \$1550 per individual. So, this would benefit high income earners, not the ordinary person.
- **4.** Wants to deport 1.3 million or 8.3 million unauthorized immigrant workers. The estimated cost over 10 years is nearly \$1 trillion dollars. First he wanted local police to handle the deportation, now he says he would invoke emergency wartime powers, active the military reservists and rely on like-minded Republican governors to carry out the deportation. This is not reflected in debt numbers.
- 5. Trump tax and spending proposals would increase the national deficit by \$5.8 trillion over the next 10 years.

- 19. Expand startup expense deduction for small businesses from \$5,000 to \$50,000.
- 20. Cut red tape by making it easier for small businesses to file taxes and remove unnecessary or excessive occupational licensing requirements.
- 21. Allocate one third of Federal contract dollars to small businesses.

 - e. <u>John Kelly- Trump's former Chief of Staff-</u>a person who admires autocrats and murderous dictators and has nothing but contempt for our democratic institutions and rule of law.
 - f. <u>Bill Bar-</u> Trump's former Attorney General "a consummate narcissist who constantly engages in reckless conduct that puts his political followers and Republican agenda at risk." He's a bully.
 - g. <u>James Mattis, Trump's Secretary of Defense (the first one)-</u>Trump is the first President in my lifetime who does not try to unite the American people, instead he tries to divide us.

- h. <u>General Mark Milley-</u> Trump's Chairman of the Joint Chiefs- "we don't take an oath ot a wannabe dictator, we take it to the Constitution.

 - k. <u>Elaine Chao- Trump's Secretary of Transportation-</u>who resigned after January 6: "At a particular point the events were such that it was impossible for me to continue, given my personal values and my philosophy.
 - I. <u>Richard Spencer-</u> Trump's first Secretary of the Navy- "...the president has very little understanding of what it means to be in the military, to fight ethically or to be governed by a uniform set of rules and practices."
 - m. In summary only half of Trump's former cabinet supports him to be re-elected.
